



# HONESTY BECOMESHER

Throughout history, honesty has been one of the most valued, desired, manipulated, exploited and, at times, diluted elements of human character.

Children learn to tell the truth, often after human instinct has led them to hide that broken vase or the fact they just hit their little sister.

Scripture extols the virtues of honesty, while vividly painting the tragic consequences of its absence.

Modern culture encourages us to let our "true self" shine, while lauding air-brushed images and discarding or concealing

those individuals whose truths make us uncomfortable.

Francesca Battistelli is decidedly countercultural. Turning on the lights, pulling back the curtains, she is unabashedly in pursuit of honesty and passionately committed to help a darkened world not only seek truth, but live in it.

"I think the world is hungry for truth, whether they want to believe it or not," she says.

With honesty her clarion call, the 2011 GMA Artist of the Year approached her latest album with steady feet upon the firm foundation of divine inspiration.


"If We're Honest had to be the title," she says. "You write the songs you need to hear. This was about being transparent and going deeper spiritually."

For her journey she brought along a fresh spirit of creativity and a very well-stocked diaper bag. Now a mother of two, Francesca's brave new world revolves not only around her music, but her family, as well—both of which inspire the other. From beginning to end,

the album is a diary of every busy, stressed, delighted, joyful, yet very real mom.

"My son is three, and my daughter is one and a half," she shares. "They play really well together, but the jump from one to two was dramatic! It's amazing but definitely harder."

Francesca playfully and sincerely weaves her tales of parenting adventures and misadventures throughout the record. "Before the Crazy Kicks In" is a charming play-by-play of the chaos that is toddler-



rearing, leaving absolutely no room for doubt that Francesca is a lot like the rest of us.

"I'll walk off the stage and change a diaper," she says with a laugh. "We're just thankful we get to travel together as a family. We don't know how long we'll be able to tour with all of us. We think about homeschooling and making plans for the future, but we're open to what God has for us."

That willingness inspired the hooky chorus of the project's first single, "Write Your Story."

"Jeremiah 29:11 has been my verse for a while now," she says. "The idea is that God is the one who we want holding the pen of our lives. We put a lot of pressure on ourselves

to come up with a plan and go make it happen. God wants us involved and to steward, but He really just wants our willingness and availability. That's how I've tried to live my life."

By any standard, Francesca has been diligent in her quest to live life wide open to the direction of her Savior. Likewise, her penchant to be vulnerable and apply just the right amount of restraint

through her songs has allowed all of us to see a bit of ourselves inside her honest, charming lyrics and hooky, singable, beautiful melodies and arrangements.

Perhaps it's no surprise, then, that the title track of the album emerged over a conversation with good friends.

"I was going through some stuff with different relationships and was saying how I wish they would just be honest with me," she says.

"There's this lie in the church that's keeping us isolated and telling us we're alone. We hear that if you have a problem, you keep it

to yourself or people will reject you. So we keep our secrets and struggles and sins to ourselves and live in these little islands and not have any real relationships. God wants us to live in community together."

Taking her own words to heart, Francesca and her family are building their own community, and doing so in a way that they can build and maintain real relationships over time. Recently, they relocated to Nashville from Atlanta.

"We left two sets of grandparents in Atlanta; but now that we're in Nashville, the recordmaking process has become so refreshing," she says. "I could wake up, feed the kids, go

> write and come back home. I felt like I had a handle on it for the first time as a mom."

It's a handle she has received from God and wielded with grace.

It's also one she's willing to relinquish if that's the Lord's leading. But for now, she is firmly planted in the garden of creativity, blossoming ever more day-by-day as a mother, a wife and a woman of God.

"Ideally, I'd love to be

making music as long as possible," she says. "But for now, knowing that our family can be together literally every moment of every day is such a blessing."

Whether it's her own headlining tour, part of an all-star ensemble, as on the Son of God tour, or as a mom making breakfast, Francesca is honestly living a life of beautiful imperfection, dangerous-but-precious vulnerability and arms-wide-open transparency.





# CAROLINE LUSK

SHAWN MCDONALD has created pensive, moving, raw music since he first came on the scene in 2004 with Simply Nothing. The ten years since have been full of highs and lows. While his music worked its way into the hearts and playlists of people everywhere, the personal struggles of marriage, divorce and an overall sense of darkness loomed large in his life. Despite the challenges, Shawn continued to use his circumstances as a muse to create music the world needed to hear. Today, however, that shadow is lifted. Refreshed and in a new state of grace, Shawn's personal joy has come to life on his latest record, Brave, With a more electronic, up-beat sound than on any of his previous work, the title is not only apt: it could serve as a moniker for Shawn himself. CCM talked with Shawn about the new music and about this new phase of life. Read on to see how God has led him out of the darkness and be inspired to break free from your own.

**CCM:** The entire record is sonically very different from your past work. What was different about this creative process?

SHAWN: I never like to recreate the past. I want to always be growing and changing. I want my life to reflect that, and I try to be that way in music. When I approach any record, I want to be a better writer. This album is that—progressively different, even down to the melody and style of music. I spent two to three years writing it and pulled it together very differently than any other record. I tried to be culturally relevant. When it comes down to it, I'm a journey writer. I write about my life experiences and try to stay true to my everyday life. I don't want to be a hit writer because it's cool. I have to sing these songs, so I have to have something that would naturally come out of myself.



**CCM:** You've worked with producer Christopher Stevens in the past, but there were some new faces in the production booth on this record. Obviously, that had to contribute to the new sounds and overall vibe. How did you end up with the production line-up?

**SHAWN:** I worked with three producers on this one, which was a new experience as well. I've done every project with Christopher Stevens, who also works with tobyMac, Mandisa, Britt Nicole and other pretty big artists. He's really like family to me.

With this one, though, we both wanted to go some places we hadn't gone before. I had never worked with David Garcia before. He's a little more pop than I was used to; but it was a fresh, good match, so we gave him three songs. Then, I stumbled upon Jamie Kenny. I'm the first CCM artist he's ever recorded. I felt honored that he gave me a chance and some time.

All three producers are different, but musically we tied the whole project together in a way that feels like one piece.

**CCM:** You've always been driven by your live shows, which probably look pretty different with this batch of songs. What changes have you made to your shows?

SHAWN: It is different. I'm using a full band and integrating a lot of things I've never used before, like tracks. I really even hesitate to say it because musicianship is so important to me. But some of these songs are so big, it's hard to pull off that kind of instrumentation with a couple of guys. Finances aren't always there, so you have to get creative. This music has more electronic components. My drummer fires tracks in real time. It's a really engaging show. I'm a guitar player by nature, but this round we wrote a lot on piano. Now, I'm trying to learn to get out from behind the guitar and move a lot and interact with the audience. It just lets people in. The sweet songs are even more tender; and overall, it's just a more exciting show.

**CCM:** Excitement doesn't come from nowhere. Is it fair to say that your personal happiness in phase of life has played out on these tracks? **SHAWN:** I've been in a very joyous season. There's been a lot of time for healing, and I really don't think there's one specific thing you can put a finger on. I don't even know when the shift happened. After a lot of processing and really figuring myself out, I found my passion again. I appreciate the darker season. It makes you stronger, but I was ready for some light.

I called the album *Brave* not just because of a song; the entire album was a departure of what I've done in the past, and that's scary. Music always comes with a bit of judgment. I've lived a lot of my life in fear of what others would think of me, and I made a lot of mistakes along the way. Part of bravery, for me, is simply laying down my fears, inadequacies and thoughts, believing that God will use a broken human heart even if I don't have it all together.

I'm always trying to discover what God is to me; what He wants me to share and what that looks like. As an artist, we're put on a stage, and it's easy to get lost in all the expectations of what we're supposed to be and lose who we really are. We overcomplicate our lives with whatever until we realize that God accepts us. He loves our hearts. All of us are broken. All of us need to discover our need for God. I want to be someone who can communicate messages that will help people heal.

One of the stories I continually think about it in pursuing music is the story of the master and the talents. One of those guys actually invests the talents and brings back more. I think God gives us all gifts and talents, but a

lot of us don't pursue them and tend to bury rather than invest them. I take the content of my songs very seriously and try not to exclude people but invite them in so they, too, can realize what God is all about.

**CCM:** Who has represented bravery in your life?

SHAWN: Jason Holtridge is a pastor of a small church in Michigan. He's very open-minded, and he brings in a lot of messy people. He has a gift for loving broken people. When I was going through a rough time, he let me live in his basement, be involved in his community and let me have a normal life. He really impacted my heart and my mind and was one of the key people who helped me come out of the season of fog.

**CCM:** Now that the fog is lifting, what does your world as a father and friend look like? **SHAWN:** Home is awesome. I have a beautiful little boy who is a big part of my life. We're involved in a really awesome community. They've accepted me and brought me in to exist with them. They've not been fans; they've been friends. It's a good season of life.

onnie McClurkin is a living legend in gospel music. For decades now, the Grammy, Dove and Stellar award-winning artist has defied racial and genre boundaries, while remaining true to his mostly traditional gospel roots. On his latest project, Duets (RCA Inspiration), Donnie celebrates his gospel home base by tracking high-powered pairings with diverse musical legends such as Tye Tribbett, John P. Kee, Tramaine Hawkins and Israel Houghton. In this CCM exclusive, the dynamic songster narrates for readers the fun and importance of singing together.

CCM: For years you have been known for big-named collaborations. What inspired the release of a project like Duets now? DONNIE: Two years ago, I was on a gospel cruise where all the artists on board met to talk about the state of gospel music—without managers or record executives. Fred Hammond commented that to generate more heat we would have to start collaborating like the hip-hop and pop artists. That statement stuck in my spirit, and that's where the concept of *Duets* came from.

CCM: You have had a substantial solo career. Why share the platform?

**DONNIE:** God has always wanted us to be one. Jesus said in John 17, "Father, may they be one as we are one." When we try to do things solo it makes it so Herculean! [Laughs] We all work best together. Some have made

ministry private territory. We can't allow that to happen. It's time to bring the genuine image of what it means to minister back to the forefront and show the world that we are united.

CCM: How did each veteran contribute to the recording? **DONNIE:** Being professionals, every artist brought such expertise, their signature, to the song I wrote. The energy of Tye Tribbett is phenomenal. The wisdom and songwriting ability of Israel Houghton is inspiring. Tramaine Hawkins, who has been my idol for decades, was legendary. Dorinda Clark-Cole requires you to stretch. She never stops singing; the rifts go on and on. Preashea Hilliard has such a genuine heart for ministry, and it comes through when she sings. Every artist made the CD a classic work of art.

CCM: Yes, this record is a celebration of great partnerships. But is there a deeper purpose and meaning to these songs and these pairings?

DONNIE: I hope this project inspires others to work together in delivering the message of God's love. I would like to do this again with CCM artists such as Mac Powell, Chris Tomlin, Natalie Grant, Jeremy Camp, Michael W. Smith, Brandon Heath and Nichole Nordeman to prove that there really is no divide between gospel and CCM but that there is one Lord over all!



# PAULBALOCHE

WRITING THE SONGS THE WHOLE CHURCH SINGS

here is a certain blanket of wisdom that, if you seek it, comes over time. It wraps around a true and honest place where you are surrounded by good friends and family and have nothing left to prove. A place where you know who you are, you know your purpose and you're content to leave the details up to God.

"If you do something long enough, you uncover life lessons along the way," Paul Baloche says. "You aspire to be faithful to God's calling in your life, pressing through even when you fall short. And when you hit a certain age, as you grow in your faith, you recognize the potential and the burden of being a leader, realizing 'I've got to step up and be more intentional toward the people

God has put in my life.' And your prayer becomes, 'Lord, give me grace to finish well.'"

After twenty-seven years of marriage to his wife and songwriting partner, Rita, twenty-four years leading worship at Community Christian Fellowship in Lindale, Texas, twenty-two years of ministry/recording with Integrity Music and hundreds of teaching resources provided free for churches, one might think Paul Baloche had already qualified for a great finish.

But for this faithful modern hymn writer, author (God Songs: How to Write and Select Songs for Worship), mentor and teacher who once aspired to be a priest, ministry is not a sprint but a marathon, a long series of obedient steps in the same direction. A path where every aspect of life is forged in fires





of passion for Jesus and His church, and the result is almost always an honest prayer for the church to sing.

And the church has responded. Paul Baloche is one of the most acclaimed songwriters of our time. The winner of multiple Dove Awards, he is also the artist behind radio standards, including "Because of Your Love," "Hosanna (Praise Is Rising)" and "Our God Saves." And he is the writer of top-ranking CCLI songs and modern-day classics such as "Above All," "Open the Eyes of My Heart," "A New Hallelujah" and "Your Name." In short, Paul writes songs that the whole church sings. It's a calling he doesn't take lightly.

"When I'm writing worship songs," Paul explains, "I realize that I'm offering a vocabulary for people to sing back to God.

My hope is that, as they sing those words with melodies, it will act as a catalyst in their hearts, creating transformation deep down in their soul."


Paul's newest release, a CD/DVD simply and appropriately titled *LIVE*, is a recording of great passion made possible by complete transparency before the Lord. "On a Friday night outside of Toronto, a thousand leaders came together to form a congregation of one to worship God," Paul says of the unforgettable night of worship. "A unique sound from singers of varied denominations and generations, raising old hymns and new songs as sung prayers... raw, spontaneous, and unpolished... Our hope was to capture a true and honest expression of worship to our God."

Featuring eleven memorable, worshipengaging songs, *LIVE* resounds with resurrection and life, essential, classic songs of hope and faith that carry us through Easter and beyond. From the rousing opening anthems, "Our God Saves," "God My Rock" and the new Matt Maher co-write "You Lift Us Up," LIVE sets a tempo of joyful declaration.

"You lift us up, you lift us up, and what was dead is raised again, in your great love..."

From there, Paul leads this congregation of worship leaders into contemplative worship with "The Same Love" and "Jesus Be My Savior," an emotive, acoustic ballad sure to





become an Easter/Communion standard.

"It wasn't nails that kept Him there, that held our Maker's hands in place

It was a love that overcame our sin and shame"

"Mighty Fortress" and "My Hope" follow, two engaging spin-offs of classic hymns, the first co-written by Paul and Aaron Shust, the latter a revisionist take on the 1834 hymn, "My Hope Is Built On Nothing Less," cowritten with Ed Kerr, Sheila Rabe and Alyssa Mellinger.

"He Is Risen," a powerful, mid-to-up-tempo chorus of resurrection and celebration, punctuates LIVE's undeniable congregational appeal, exhorting all to "sing with all creation, sing of a world made new / in His life we too may live, bursting from the tomb..." A brandnew song written with worship veteran Graham Kendrick, "He Is Risen" looks beyond Christ's death and resurrection and toward His glorious return, a perfect lead-in to the Baloche/Brenton Brown-penned "Glorious" and its benediction of "Holy, Holy, Holy."

All in all, *LIVE* is an inspiring, heartfelt evening of worship intended for an audience of One, a gathering of Spirit-filled believers compelled to sing of their Savior. For more than a quarter century, this has been the heartbeat and calling of Paul Baloche, to write worship songs and invite his brothers and sisters to join in the song. To be real. To be intentional. To live and be present in the worship moment.

"When I meet people who are full of the Spirit—despite their present circumstances, beyond their temperament or attitude—I'm inspired," Paul says. "I want to be that kind of person, to be in His presence, to read and digest His Word, to make it part of my DNA, to walk it out—to live it out. In the end, I want my life, my music, to facilitate a conversation about God and who He is."

ORDER OF SERVICE: Picking the songs was the hardest part. The first time I sat down with a pen and paper to select songs for the project, I came up with enough titles to fill Volumes 2, 3, 4 and maybe more! There are people like me who grew up singing the hymns and need to be reminded of the amazing melodies and deep theology of these songs. There is also an entire generation that never sat in a church pew with a hymnal. I love the songs of the modern church and worship music; I even wrote some of those songs, but it is a shame if these hymns don't become familiar to this younger audience, too. – M.W.S.





LYRIC PRIORITY: I wanted to "stay out of the way" of the lyrics with the music and production. You don't need to add a lot to a song like "Old Rugged Cross." It speaks for itself. This is definitely a case where less is more. – M.W.S.

VINTAGE VIBE: In the studio I surrounded myself with hymnals. I had some, my mom and dad had some and Amy Grant let me borrow a bushel basket of old—some very old—hymnals. To imagine the hands that held those hymnals, the voices that sang from those pages... it is amazing that the songs in these old books are as relevant and true today as they were when they were first published. Just being in the room with some of these hymnals was inspiring to me. -M.W.S. □□M

I've worked with thousands of independent Christian artists over the years and frequently run into the same questions over and over again. Some artists are throwing darts at an unknown target in a dark room. Others think they have all the answers and end up making poor decisions based on incomplete information.

My philosophy is: the more you know, the more you'll grow. This is the third in a three-part series of responses to some of the most frequently asked questions. Open your mind, pray over the advice you find here and be blessed on your journey.

Question #3: With social media inundating our lives, what's the best way to tackle my personal marketing and promotion so that I still have time to make music?

The first priority of any artist is to create great content. People are drawn to excellence and are rarely attracted by mediocrity. In everything you do, from your music, to your communication, branding and anything else that can be consumed and judged, pursue excellence.

Once you have content, you must market it. With the nearly limitless options of social media, you must be strategic in your approach. Without a plan, you're likely to drift off into the abyss of your Facebook wall or Instagram account and you waste time—time that cannot be regained.

Develop a strategy. A simple outline could look something like this:

1. Assess your content, determining the most appropriate outlets and platforms for your style and message.

- 2. Know your audience. You must learn who your followers are before you can be relevant to them.
- 3. Develop your story. More than ever, there is a premium on personality. Anyone can put out music. It's your story—your struggles, victories, your heart and soul—that will bring you to life and draw people in. For help in developing your story and inner vision, visit www.theinnervizion.com/thediscoveryprocess.pdf.
- 4. Establish consistently high-quality visual outlets. Put some thought into your Facebook page, website or other online platform. Make sure your pictures and bio are current and look great. Make sure your contact info is visible and that your site is intuitive and easy to navigate.
- 5. Ask for help! If social or web savvy isn't your thing, find someone who specializes in it to either guide you or literally do it for you. Maximize your strengths and find good people to help you where you are lacking.

Building a brand is hard work and takes a lot of time. Be strategic, build a team and prayerfully follow the Lord's leading in your time management and resource distribution.

# CHARACTER ASSESSMENT

SUPERMOM **PATRICIA HEATON** SHARES WHAT SHE'S LEARNED FROM THE MOMS SHE'S PLAYED AND WHY EVERY MOM NEEDS A MOM'S NIGHT OUT

It's not easy being a mom. Sometimes, we just need to get away for a minute. That's the heart of Mom's Night Out. Starring Patricia Heaton (Everybody Loves Ramon, The Middle), Sean Astin, Sarah Drew and Trace Adkins, the movie is funny, encouraging and quite literally the ultimate experience for a mom's night out!

CCM spoke with Heaton about the film and the many different moms she has portrayed on the big and small screen.

CCM: Out of all the moms you've portrayed over the years, is there one that has been the most representative of "Patricia the mom"?

Patricia: Deborah really represented me at that time in my life. I had young children, and I understood. I know how women can be disappointed with their husbands a lot when it comes to parenting youngsters. It was relatable to a lot of women.

Now I'm playing a mom on *The Middle*. That corresponds to where I am in my life. We're going through things like getting them off to college, not being able to help on homework, dating, using the Internet, that kind of thing.

Frankie happens to work and is trying to juggle being a working mom, trying to stay involved in her kids' lives...I feel like I related to both of those characters...

CCM: In Mom's Night Out, you take on a new role—not only a mom but a pastor's wife. Did you identify with her? What do you hope people take away from this film?

**PH:** I liked the character after we worked on her a bit. It's a tricky position, being a pastor's wife. They have it tough and often feel isolated. Their husband gets all the attention, and she's doing the grunt work and raising a family. This is really the first time a comedy has been done in the family-friendly genre. It's a really fun way to have a good time. I hope it's an encouragement.

CCM: You're probably an authority on parenting at this point. What do you think is essential to being a good mom?

PH: Your brain needs to sleep at night. There's a reason we have to sleep—you have to recharge. That's the same as going out with your friends, taking a breath of fresh air and thinking about something other than the kids. It helps you appreciate, take a step back, and remember why you love them.

CCM: It's a fairly common conclusion that being a Christian in Hollywood is challenging. How have you continued to grow in your faith? PH: If you're developing at all, there's always room for improvement. The balance is between having discipline in your own life to keep your self open spiritually. Whether it's reading or meditation or prayer or being part of a church community, you have to know that God can do anything through you anytime He wants regardless of where you're at or how self-disciplined you are. We're responsible, but He is ultimately occupying a central place in our lives.
