Fighting Misconceptions

Best-selling author Terri Blackstock was devastated when she discovered her daughter had a severe drug addiction.

Thankfully Blackstock was able to find help for her daughter—who has since recovered—but through the process, she learned a lot about addiction and treatment. With her daughter's blessing, she wrote about it in her novel Intervention and its sequel Vicious Cycle.

The third and final book of the series, Downfall (Zondervan). brings back

characters from both books—including Blackstock's favorite, Barbara Covington.

"I poured so much of myself into her," she

says. "In *Downfall* things have settled down and seem to be on the upswing for Barbara and her family—until someone sets a bomb under her daughter Emily's car. She thinks Emily has drifted back into the drug culture and that all the chaos is beginning again. I've felt Barbara's paranoia and the feeling that at any minute the other shoe is going to drop.

"The biggest misconception people have

about addiction is that it onlyhappenstopeoplefrom dysfunctional, unbelieving homes. The reality is that it also happens to those of us who've raised our kids in Christian households. who've never had alcohol or drugs in our homes,



who've done our best to raise up our children in the way they should go. My daughter never did drugs until she was away at [Christian] college and was an adult."

> Blackstock hopes the trilogy shows just how awful addiction can be. But if she could only convey one thing to readers, it would be


that Christ forgives and redeems. "He gives addicts the power to change and family members the power to go on. He truly does help us carry our burdens. And sometimes He uses our suffering in powerful ways that help many others." FF

When a publisher first pitched Bill Myers on the prospect of writing a "Christian horror series," the author was taken aback.

But as he thought about the grip that the supernatural has on teens today, he took the challenge—on one condition: "Let me turn it into an educational series." Bill told

them. "I'll promise you the same page-turning drama that the others provide, but let me turn this into something that glorifies God and literally educate

the reader to the counterfeits that are out there."

Now available in brand new three-inone editions. The Forbidden Doors series follows three teens in their struggle against supernatural forces of darkness. Each of the twelve novels focuses on a specific supernatural counterfeit—from boards, reincarnation and séances, to beings having an angelic appearance, UFOs and Wicca.

But these books aren't just thrilling—they help readers separate fact from fiction. "I read between 40-80 books per novel that I write, just to make sure that I get the facts correct," Bill says.


Since its original launch, The Forbidden Doors series has sold nearly 400,000 copies, and won the C.S. Lewis Honor Award. Response from teens has been enthusiastic and grateful. Some have been warned about the dangers hidden within things they thought were harmless, while others have used the books to help educate their friends.

"This series seems to be not only a defensive measure, as far as warning the reader," Bill says, "but also an offensive measure that gives the reader tools to reach into their culture to friends who may be already caught up in some of the counterfeits."






After a long hiatus from bookshelves, the blockbuster author returns with Illusion (Howard Books), a novel that blend elements of suspense, mystery and sci-fi. But, he says, the novel is ultimately a celebration of love.

Even with 15 million books in print, there is still awe in Frank Peretti's voice when he talks about storytelling. "Stories can speak to the heart in a very special way," he says. "That's what novels do. They reflect the human experience. We identify with the characters, feel the same emotions, the realization and awareness. Stories work."

He ought to know. Ever since his first novel This Present Darkness hit shelves in 1986 and its sequel Piercing the Darkness followed in 1989, readers across the globe have clamored for more stories from Frank Peretti. It's been six years since his last novel *Monster* graced the bestseller lists, but this March, Howard Books will release *Illusion*, the novel we've all been waiting for.

"If people have picked up my Darkness books and read them thinking they're the kind of books I write, they're going to find a big, big difference in Illusion," Peretti says. "I write from my heart wherever the journey takes me. *Illusion*



is a book written by a 60-year-old man who's lived and loved his wife for 40 years and is basically writing about it. That's a much different book than one written by a man in his 30s who's all gaga about angels and demons."

With elements of suspense, mystery, and sci-fi, *Illusion* tells the tale of Dane and Mandy Collins. For nearly 30 years they've been a popular magic act, sticking together through thick and thin. Then Mandy is killed in a fiery car wreck. Or is she? Playing with

the idea of characters crossing dimensions and transversing space, *Illusion* asks the question, what if you could revert a person back to a previous state? "You know how computers are these days," Peretti says. "You can take them back to the way they were months ago. That's the concept for this whole experiment, this reversion, that goes on in the book. Mandy is surreptitiously carried away at the point of death and reverted, accidentally, 40 years.

"[But at its heart] this novel is a celebration of love and commitment. My favorite part was living and feeling vicariously through Mandy and Dane my own relationship with my sweet wife, Barbara. There's a lot of me and Barb in this book. Of all the characters I've written, right now Mandy is my favorite because she so perfectly embodies faith and hope. She doesn't give up. She trusts God even when she thinks she's crazy in a world where nobody knows her and she has no identity. She still clings to the Lord for her security. She's a Seabiscuit. She's a Rocky. She's just gonna fight her way through and survive."

Many of Peretti's early works have been blatantly evangelistic in their tone and content, but *Illusion* takes a more subtle approach. "I'm kind of in C.S. Lewis mode here," Peretti adds. "This one is more metaphorical. It's the whole gospel, but it's

all couched in a different kind of world. If I can just write a story that talks about how beautiful a love relationship can be, and how wonderful it is for people to be married and in love for 40 years, that in itself is message enough!

Illusion is a story of love."

A firm believer in the power of Christian fiction, Peretti doesn't take for granted his calling to build up the body of Christ. "What's art for?" he asks. "It's to communicate ideas on an aesthetic level. The best way to understand the human experience is through a Judeo Christian worldview, because that's where everything falls together and makes sense. I'm a storyteller. My role is to tell a story because a story can give a whole other dimension to a thought."

Rita Award finalist Terri Reed was told by her creative writing professor in college that she should be writing for Harlequin.

She never forgot that advice. A decade later, Terri made the decision to pursue a writing career and targeted Harlequin—but her voice did not fit. "It wasn't until the Love Inspired Romance line started 1996 that I found where my voice and my worldview fit." In 2008, Tracy J. Trost shot his first movie Find Me in nine days on a shoestring budget. It was the fulfillment of a lifelong dream. Since then, Trost Moving Pictures produced A Christmas Snow, which was based on a novel by Jim Stovall and became a hit stage production in Branson last holiday season (it's coming again this year too.) Through the process Tracy became friends with Stovall and learned that Stovall wanted to turn his novel *The Lamp* into a movie, too.

"Jim is an enigma," Tracy says. "There is no one you can compare him to because he stands out all by himself. He is a man with the highest integrity, and he is a very deep thinker. I was drawn to his book's concept that whatever you are focusing on in life, that's what your life eventually becomes. We need to realize that our lives today are a direct result of our belief system and formed by the choices and decisions we've made up until this point. If we want our lives to be different we need to retrain our brains and our thinking. The Lamp has this message at its core."

When asked how his faith affects his films, Tracy is quick to say it would be extremely difficult for him to write or produce something that didn't have some sort of spiritual basis. "It's not just what I believe," he says. "It's who I am. My faith in God has made me the person I am today, and it would be impossible for me to share a truth that isn't based on that. Jesus sat at the gate of the city telling parables. This is how He got his message out to the people. He would present a Kingdom principle through storytelling.



"The biggest influence on our society today is media. If we want to reach the world, TV and movies are two of the best ways to do that. Movies impact people's lives because they are stories. With *The Lamp's* story, we share that you can do anything you want in life if you first believe

Q&A: Janice Cantore

A former Long Beach, Calif., police officer of twenty-two years, Janice Cantore worked a variety of assignments, including patrol, administration, juvenile investigations, and training. A few years ago, Janice retired to a house in the mountains of Southern California, where she writes suspense novels designed to keep readers engrossed and leave them inspired. Her latest suspense title is Accused (Tyndale House), the first volume in her Pacific Coast Justice series.

Q: What were your goals in writing *Accused*?

When I started writing Accused, I was writing it for my aunt Elinor to read. At the time, she was not a Christian, so the challenge was writing a Christianthemed novel she would like, one that might show her the need for her salvation. Unfortunately, she passed away from cancer before it was finished. But she did come to know the Lord at the end. I still want to write Christian-themed novels non-Christians will enjoy. I also want to tell good stories that will communicate biblical truths without being preachy. As a police officer, I saw so much hopelessness. I often escaped to good fiction and knew that good fiction with themes of hope and truth was what I wanted to write.

Q: What elements of your new Pacific Coast Justice series are driven by your real-life experiences as a police officer?

I worked graveyard patrol for a good portion of the time I was in the field, so I decided that would be Carly's world. The idea behind the juvenile accused of murder germinated from a rather gruesome crime committed by a minor when I was in juvenile. As I thought about the boy being detained for murder, I played the what-if game—"What if he was innocent in spite of all the evidence?"—and decided that would make a good story. But it's never just work life happens, so I gave Carly a frustrating backstory of divorce and controversy, things I saw at work but thankfully never experienced personally.

Q: When you were on the job, how often did you think, "Wow, this would make a great idea for a story"?

What usually impacted me at work was the tragic. I prayed for people often but was seldom privy to how the story ended. Amazingly,



when I did find out what happened, if God was involved, it was always an inspirational finish. I've blogged about a traffic accident I handled where a nine-month-old boy was killed after his mother fell asleep at the wheel. About a year later, I read an interview with the woman where she talked about how her faith carried her through that tragedy and made her marriage stronger. While the incident itself sounds horrible, what grew from the tragedy was inspiring. I tend to be pessimistic on first pass, but Christ makes you optimistic. And what God can work in the face of the worst fills people with hope and inspiration. So from work I saw the tragic, but the story is in what God can do in any situation. Hope from tragedy always uplifts people. The first time I actually sat down to write about something was after the Rodney King riots. We worked twelve-hour days for seven days straight, and I was working the day things exploded. I tried to write about it but couldn't translate the feelings to the page. I decided that what happened word for word isn't necessarily entertaining. The best story contains elements of truth and elements of a vivid imagination.

Q: When did you first know you wanted to become a writer—and what did you do about it?

I used to write horse stories when I was a child and had spiral-bound notebooks filled with those stories. I always wanted to write but was told often that I would never make a living as an author. I took creative writing in college, but the teacher didn't like anything I wrote, so I didn't think I would ever be able to call myself a writer. When I learned that writing is like anything else that is important—you have to work on it to be good at it—I decided it was something I wanted to work on. Accused as it is in print now came from more drafts than I can count because it was the first novel I started. I applied lessons I learned from writers' conferences, from books, and I'm fortunate that God put in my path accomplished writer Lauraine Snelling, who became a mentor and friend. She edited the early drafts for me, and I've learned a great deal from her over the years. I know now that the learning never stops. No one I know of writes a perfect-neverhas-to-be-edited first draft, and writing can always be improved.

Q: What are the most challenging aspects of incorporating your faith into your story?

Not being preachy. I would like my books to appeal to a wide audience. I think preachy turns a large segment off. My aunt Elinor would have stopped reading "preachy," even if it was my book.

Q: What do you most hope readers get from reading your fiction?


Encouragement, a feeling of hope, and being uplifted. The Good News of our Savior. I truly believe that with Christ there is always hope, no matter the darkness of the situation. I want my stories to communicate that truth in an enjoyable and exciting way.

Q: Why do you think storytelling is such a powerful way to communicate truth?

Everyone relates to a good story. People who have moved me through their writing-Francine Rivers, Randy Alcorn, Terri Blackstock—they write page-turners that communicate faith in real-life situations. When you put one of their books down, you are sorry you've finished—and you have something important and special to think about. Storytelling takes people to new and interesting worlds. The truth doesn't change, but sometimes people can see it better if it's coming from a different setting.

Her persistence paid off when Sushi for One (Zondervan) released in 2007, followed with two more novels. "I loved writing the Sushi series," Camy says. "But I found when I was plotting the books, I kept nixing all these dead bodies that would sneak into the storyline! When it came time to start a new series I naturally gravitated toward humorous romantic suspense so I wouldn't have to waste time editing out the danger and murders." **FF**

of a giant Philistine, he fights giant robots. And instead of a land battle between the Philistines and the Israelites, the land battle is for Earth. Alienation (Thomas Nelson) is loosely based on the idea of Saul trying to murder David, and how David handled it with dignity and compassion."

66 I wanted it to be a loose retelling of the life of David. Instead of a giant Philistine, he fights giant robots.

Jon made the move to writing for a Christian publisher with little difficulty. "I try to ensure my worldview permeates everything I write, and since the Bible informs my worldview, there weren't any problems at all."

In addition to his love for writing, Jon has a passion for theology, comic books, movies, WWII, the Minnesota Vikings and spending time with his wife and kids.


With seven romance novels under her belt, Betsy St. Amant dives into world of young adult fiction with Addision Blakely: Confessions of a PK (Barbour).



Andrew and Jon got their start helping their father at his TV station job. In exchange, they were allowed to use the equipment from midnight to 4 am. "From there it was a hobby that grew out of control," Andrew says. "We fell in love with telling stories." Up until their 20s the brothers made their living as sports cameramen, but their big break came in directing the documentary *The Cross and* the Towers, a film about the iron cross found

at ground zero after 9-11. They have since directed 50 Christian music videos the likes of Skillet. Michael W. Smith and Casting Crowns.

"Sometimes as filmmaker you go out to find your stories," Andrew says. "But



most of the time they find you. We heard a girl named Gianna Jessen speak on YouTube. She's an abortion survivor. She has cerebral palsy as a result, but has an

amazing outlook on life. Rather than film a documentary, we decided to become more subversive with October Baby and make a charming, coming-of-age love story. Looking at abortion through the eyes of the victim was much less polarizing.

"At its core the movie really is about forgiveness," Andrew adds. "Ultimately, no matter what the viewers' background or views on the subject, I hope they go away being very moved. I don't feel you can change someone's mind until you move their heart." FF

TheAlmightyBible Subscribing to the Truth

The people behind The Almighty Bible graphic novels had a clear vision. "We were looking to create a series of books that are very accessible to a large number of kids," says Almighty Bible cofounder Kevin O'Donnell. To do this, they created a series of graphic novels, covering different books in the Bible.

But with economic uncertainty affecting book publishing, closing bookstores, and creating difficulties for new publications, they found themselves facing a tough question. They wanted to publish books that would get kids interested in the Bible, but how could they get the books to the kids?

After months of experimenting, they came upon a unique solution. Instead of going through bookstores, they are using a "book of the month" subscription model. Each month, a

new 150-page volume will be sent to subscribers. "We start with Luke and we mix between New Testament and Old Testament books," O'Donnell explains. Acts is the second book subscribers will receive, followed by Genesis and then Exodus. Mark, Revelation, and Joshua & Judges are some of the other upcoming titles.

The art teams behind the vibrant, colorful visuals are based in Korea. The art style will be familiar to readers of manga and comic books, but the layout of the page has a distinct and unique style. There are no word balloons or caption boxes. Instead, the text appears at the bottom of the page, beneath the artwork, along with scripture references to direct readers to the source material.

By focusing on the words in this way, O'Donnell hopes it will point young readers back to the graphic novel's source material. The Almighty Bible series was created for parents, grandparents and teachers. "They want their kids to read the Bible," O'Donnell said. "They want it to be something that will engage the kids."

In other words, they share O'Donnell's vision.



BLAST FROM THE PAST

In 1975, DC Comics published an oversized comic book called simply "The Bible." Some of the best comic book creators of the time worked on the book, with Sheldon Mayer scripting, Joe Kubert laying out the pages and editing, and Nestor Redondo finishing the artwork. DC Comics is now reprinting the classic book in a hardcover edition.

The book itself covered the book of Genesis, including the creation, Noah's Ark, and Sodom and Gomorrah. In a 1975 interview with Mayer from The Amazing World of DC Comics, he recounted the scripting process: "I rough-sketched that script rather than typed it because I needed the advice of several theologians, and it was easier for them to look at pictures than to wade through the scene descriptions."

More issues of The Bible were planned but never produced.

The latest volume in her Gates of Heaven fantasy series is The Land of Darkness (Living Ink).

What led you to write the Gates of Heaven series?

I wanted to create an original series using fairy-tale elements we are all familiar with, reworked to be completely new stories with biblical sub-

themes and metaphor. The neat thing about fairy tales is that they often feel very real and start off with characters in their ordinary world, but then magic intrudes. Like "Jack and the Beanstalk," where Jack is off to market to sell a cow so he and his mother don't starve.

What inspired The Land of Darkness?

I came across the Alexander Tales from the 4th century, one of which told of a land of darkness where Alexander the Great finds the water of life. I also wanted to do a variation of *Pilgrim's Progress*, and have a bridge that spanned the great chasm separating us from God. This book is all centered around Isaiah 53 and the parables of Jesus.

How does your faith influence your writing?

I wrote a few novels years ago for the commercial market and am still trying to sell those books. But I seriously prayed to God to tell me what to write for Him, and He led me to writing these fairy tales.

How long have you known that you wanted to be a writer?


I've been writing all my life and come from a family of professional writers—so, although I never intended to become a novelist, it was meant to be...

What do you hope that readers get from reading your work?


